## **VBHS Early Warning Signs**

1.17 School leadership teams will use the Florida Early Warning Indicators as displayed in Unify to develop and support interventions for African American students who are not on track to graduate.

## **Narrative**

Vero Beach High School identified all seniors and underclassman with a failing grade during the fourth nine weeks.<sup>1</sup> With three weeks remaining in the school year, VBHS Administration led a charge to examine grading and teaching practices schoolwide.

## **Data**

- As of May 12<sup>th</sup>, 2020, VBHS had 3,570 failing grades for the fourth quarter
- African American students made up 30% of the total course failings
- As of May 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2020, VBHS had 2,297 failing grades for the fourth quarter
- African American students made up 27% of the total course failings

## **Action Plan**

VBHS Administration will continue to work with teachers to find creative ways to evaluate student performance during these unprecedented times. Several plans and ideas have already been shared via email, phone conversations, and Microsoft Teams. The Guidance Department at VBHS is continuing to reach out to teachers and students to enroll African American students in Edgenuity in an effort to recover credit for graduation. Administrators, Department Chairs, and Teachers will continue to monitor data and work together as a team to reduce course failures among the African American population.
