Evidence of Progress Number and percentage of qualified students receiving targeted reading interventions. Principals conduct data chats and create school- based action plans which includes adjustments to instructional support based on student progress

Results of Action Taken:

Intervention K-3 teacher has begun pulling kindergarten students based on iReady and FLKRS testing. Administration, instructional coach, and intervention teacher will conduct a Make-Take Data Notebook training for student/class/and school data (scheduled for September 23, 2020) 3. Conduct K-2 and 3-5 Data Chats on September 29th and October 1st with administration, coach, and intervention teacher. African American students who are not kindergarten ready have already been placed into an intervention group.

Reflection:

Monitoring of intervention group will continue to occur through formative assessments daily. Winter iReady data will be used to determine areas of growth and areas of concern (if any). Kindergarten students will also be receiving small group instruction with classroom teacher every day in the classroom who are in Tier II and Tier III. Students in Tier I will receive enrichment opportunities.

Out of 88 Kindergarten students, 10% have not completed the iReady ELA assessment.

Out of 88 Kindergarten students, 41% are on grade level.

Out of 88 Kindergarten students, 39% are below grade level.

Out of 88 Kindergarten students, 10% have a substantial deficiency in reading.
