We are finding it is more difficult this year to get students participating in these extended learning activities. Fewer parents are signing students up. We are encouraging African American students to participate. Programs are open to all students in designated grade groups. Will work on determining ways we can recruit more participation in extended learning programs.

Currently we have the following after school programs:

Cooking Club - 3rd -5th grade

Coding Club – 4th and 5th grade

Science Club – 5th grade

Each of these programs are open to students in the identified grades who are participating in extended day.

Moonshot Academy Tutoring and Story Time – 1st-3rd grade

This program is open to students in the identified grades that are showing struggling academic performance based in iReady Diagnostic data.

This month we will be offering additional intervention supports to students before school in grades 3-5 for students identified as being in the bottom quartile.

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AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

We are excited to be offering a few new after school programs to our students this year. Our extended day program is offering the following clubs to students who are participating in after care.

Cooking Club - this is an amazing opportunity to read great works of literature and then dive into cooking lessons to make some of the wonderful treats that they read about within the stories. So far our students have made items from "Thunder

Cake" and "How To Make an Apple Pie and See The World". Who said reading and math couldn't be tasty too?

Moonshot Academy - this program will work with extended day this year to provide tutoring supports to students in grades first to third. They will also offer story time to students who are participating in after care.

Coding Club - our coding club is starting this week through after care. They are working with third through fifth grade to learn how to code with spheros and works of literature to code through reading.

This group will do hands on labs, experimentation and dig into science in ways that go beyond what they do in the classroom.
