Explanation of Evidence:

Attached are flyers created by staff to advertise extracurricular opportunities currently offered and a copy of the agenda of our first African American Student Advisory Council.

Results of Action Taken:

All staff at SRMS was trained in Implicit Bias during an August Professional Development training. All current coaches are SRMS employees and were in attendance. Staff created flyers to post in school and on social media to advertise extracurricular opportunities for students. At the Student Advisory Council, we discussed the benefits Student Engagement through extracurricular activities and clubs. We also discussed the process for establishing new clubs on campus. The council is going to survey their peers on club interests and bring back a list to discuss in our October meeting. We also discussed the barriers of student involvement surrounding transportation. Students recommended, and I agreed, to establish an opportunity for clubs to meet from 7:30-8:10 as most students are on campus by 7:45.

Reflection:

Student engagement can be enhanced and become more inclusive if we allow clubs to meet in the morning before school starts. We will be creating a schedule for staff supervision to allow clubs to meet on different days which allows students to be involved in multiple clubs and takes transportation out as a barrier. We will keep attendance of all students involved in clubs to track our subgroup involvement.

Learning Target

To provide additional support for SRMS's lowest 25% students who are considered at risk and need additional academic interventions to be successful and improve fluency and comprehension scores.

Program Title: Book Club

Targeted Population: The lowest 25% of students, who are academically and/or socially and economically disadvantaged.

Estimated Program Cost: Includes 3 Instructional Personnel at per hour/ hours per week
Books = 30 books @ \$4.95 = \$148.50 **Paint Brushes** @ \$9.98 per tube of 40 x 10 = \$99.80 **Paint Canvas** @
9.98 for package of 6 x 6 packages = \$59.88 **Acrylic Paint** 18 pack @ \$14.98 x 6 = \$89.98 **Estimated Cost**
of Snacks per week \$30.00 per week for total of 12 weeks = \$360.00 for a Total Cost of supplies \$ 757.83 +
plus salary of Instructional Personnel


