Explanation of Evidence: African American students have attended one presentation by Damien Hunte, school liaison for Keiser University. Mr. Hunte plans to continue to give motivational speeches that cover a broad range of topics to influence graduation. He has also extended an invitation to his mentoring program. In addition, all African American students have met with an academic advisor to outline required courses and credits for graduation. This will continue to occur on a monthly basis.

Results of Action Taken: Students are being motivated to continue to earn credits towards graduation. They are aware of which courses and examinations they need to take.

Reflection: Students appear to be more motivated following their meeting with the academic advisor.
