Evidence of Progress As a principal, I will monitor the number and percentage of students in advanced classes by race and list of provided supports. The process for identifying and recognizing support for students for advanced coursework moving from 5th to 6th grade include the following narrative/description processes; teacher recommendations, state test scores and data reviews by the stakeholders. During the 2020-2021 school year, we will look at our student list in 5th grade and will recommend advanced classes by using unit assessment averages, i-Ready scores, and report card information, for the midyear. The student information will also be sent to the middle school leadership teams, on an as need basis, to organize and help with class placement for the 2021-2022 school year. The top 25 percent of student would be recommended for advanced classes for the 2021-2022 school year.

elementary school.

With continued monitoring of data, Tier 1 instruction along with individualized learning paths for each student performing beyond grade level mastery will increase academic achievement for students who need advanced coursework.
