We will be reaching out to the district office to see what training/supports are available to help us align our in school suspension programs with district programs and systems. We will share this information with our PBIS team and then share it through our discipline committee narrative/description meetings with our teachers. We will share this information with parents in our School Advisory Committee meetings so they are also aware of these practices, especially if they will be a change from current practices.

Results of Action Taken:

As a result we will effectively use in school suspension programs to support student social emotional learning and academic learning. We will work to keep students progressing and reduce the amount of time out of the classroom learning environment.

We will meet with the district student support services team to learn about what programs/supports are

available for in school suspension and how to implement them within our school.

Currently no in school suspensions have been assigned. This data was shared with our PBIS/discipline committee on September 24th. Our next PBIS/discipline meeting is October 15th.
