2.6 Documentation of school-based problem-solving sessions to incorporate culturally responsive practices into the school's Tier 1 MTSS framework.

## Explanation of Evidence:

At Treasure Coast Elementary, we will discuss/implement culturally responsive teaching practices into our Tier 1 MTSS framework. MTSS meetings will occur twice a month to ensure fidelity. As a part of the problem-solving process, we will participate in weekly grade level data chats guided by instructional coaches and administration. We will review and analyze student data to drive instruction and identify any discrepancies between what is expected from all students, and what is occurring.

# Results of Action Taken:

As a result of the school-based problem solving sessions, teachers will use data to improve instruction and deliver culturally responsive teaching strategies such as communication of high expectations from all students, student-centered instruction, culturally mediated instruction, and positive perspectives on parents and families.

#### **Reflection:**

"Improved teaching comes about when teachers implement sound teaching practices grounded in cultural proficiency and a thorough understanding of the subject matter and how to teach it."
