
Goal 1: Academic Achievement


The School District of Indian River County administers teacher-created Unit Assessments in state-assessed courses. The purpose of these assessments is to provide teachers with:


- A bank of standard-based assessments that are aligned and rigorous,
- · Quality assessments that allow for consistency across schools,
- The ability to identify students that have mastered the standards in each unit, and
- Progress monitor the data to make instructional changes and re-teach for mastery.


Unit Assessment Weighted Averages

Unit Assessments are district assessments administered about twice every nine weeks. The charts displayed highlight the overall weighted average on all Unit Assessments taken during the school year aggregated by Race/Ethnicity.









Correlations to FSA Assessments: Each year, performance on Unit Assessments is analyzed in comparison to achievement on the statewide assessments in each subject area. While it depends on the grade level and subject area, typically an average score of between 55-65% on Unit Assessments correlate to a level 3 on the statewide assessment.
