In September 2022, the School District of Indian River County initiated the implementation of the 2022-2023 African American Achievement Plan. With support of the SDIRC Public Information Office we have pushed out a new school choice video for each school on our social media platforms from the Indian River County handle on facebook and twitter. These videos also play on loop on our education channel for Indian River County. In addition, we have continued with the family and community engagement series events hitting schools that have been historically low in school choice enrollment including Glendale, Dodgertown, and Sebastian Elementary. The innovation team has also joined with the Moonshot Community Action network to spread information across our non-profit and community support organizations about our school choice program open enrollment window that began on November 1st, 2022, and will continue until January 15th 2023.

In addition to the digital platform, the innovation team has distributed a total of 500 printed school choice booklets throughout Indian River County utilizing our pre-k partnerships and our early learning program supervisors. We have also placed booklets in non-traditional locations including local barber shops, church lobbies, the DMV, pediatric dentists, and pediatric doctor's offices.




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
