In October 2023, the School District of Indian River County initiated the implementation of the 2023-2024 African American Achievement Plan. During Quarter 3, we continued to use data from various assessments to create small groups and tiered instruction with a focus on students' needs. Literacy Support groups were created to give students support during Tier 2 instruction. Cultural Arts teachers have created to build habits of success and relationships. Research based strategies are being used for student engagement and teacher monitoring. Teachers have also implemented differentiation strategies to provide more targeted instruction.
