**Masterminds:**  
Masterminds is an academic quiz-bowl style club in which students compete in teams to answer questions related to the various coursework that students experience or can expect to experience in their high school careers. Masterminds has from the beginning been designed as an opportunity for students who are not necessarily athletically inclined to participate in rigorous, challenging, and exciting team competitions. The state of Florida's Commissioner's Academic Challenge is sponsored by the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA) and participation in this championship is the ultimate object for students in Masterminds.

**National Honors Society (NHS):**  
The National Honor Society (NHS) elevates a school's commitment to the values of scholarship, service, leadership, and character. A student must have a 3.5 un-weighted GPA.

**Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD):**  
Students Against Destructive Decisions, formerly Students Against Driving Drunk, is an organization whose aim is to prevent accidents from students taking potentially destructive decisions.

**Student Council :**  
The purpose of the student council is to give students an opportunity to develop leadership by organizing and carrying out school activities and service projects. In addition to planning events that contribute to school spirit and community welfare, the student council is the voice of the student body.

**Criminal Justice Club:**  
The Criminal Justice Club is an extension of the Criminal Justice Class. In addition to learning about law enforcement and our legal system, the club provides students with a safe place to discuss their emotional issues after school and will provide them with an organization of which they can call their own.

**Spirit Club:**  
The Spirit Club promote student participation across SRHS through themes at athletic events and other school spirit focused activities.

**The Sharkle:**  
An online literary magazine created by SRHS students.

## SRHS EXTRACURRICULAR PROGRAMS



**Neurodiversity Club:**  
A club for students with ASD, ADHD, and other learning differences. We seek to provide an unstructured time to socialize and problem solve events that happen during the day.

**Fly Fishing Club:**  
The Fly Fishing club is an informal club for swapping fish tales and sharing pictures and videos. We teach anyone to cast a fly rod in 15 minutes after school on the grass.

**Esports Club:**  
We plan to play competitively as part of the Florida Scholastic Esports League and the national High School Esports League. Game titles are chosen by the state and national leagues and include both PC and console gaming. Students must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 to compete.

**GSA:**  
Gender Sexuality Alliance, formerly Gay Straight Alliance, is for LGBTQ+ students and allies of the community. Students discuss their personal journey, raise awareness and advocate for issue.

**African American Student Council:**  
The African American Student Council is a place for students to discuss issues specific to African American Students as well as participate in service projects.

**Foreign Cultures:**  
The Foreign Culture Club explores food, music, and customs from around the world.

**Legacy Yearbook:**  
The school's yearbook is produced by students that meet during a Leadership Class and their lunch break. Additionally, these students participate in supporting and promoting other school events through the year. Students must apply in the spring to be on staff the following year. Staff members are encouraged to maintain a 3.0 or higher GPA.

**Chick-Fil-A Leadership Academy:**  
Students are selected to participate in Chick-fil-A Leader Academy. The seven-month program focuses on making an impact through action and training leaders within local communities.

**National Technical Honor Society:**  
An honor society for students in Career & Technical Education Courses. To be eligible students must be enrolled or have completed a CTE Course, have a minimum "weighted" GPA 3.3, and must have have an "A" average in their CTE course.
