Subject: IB Numbers for Minority Report

Good Morning.

I've put together a snapshot (to the best of my ability for the information I could find) concerning the IB Programme from the Diploma students (juniors and seniors) to the pre-IB students (freshmen and sophomores). I included the numbers starting in academic year 2017-2018 through this year (my first full year as IB Coordinator). If you have any questions, please reach out to me. Below is a quick example of what you will see.

- 42 SENIORS in FULL IB Diploma Programme (Class of 2018) 35/42 EARNED IB Diploma (83%)
 - White = 30(71%)(59%) 24/30 Earned Diploma (80%)
 - Hispanic = 11 (26%) (26%) 10/11 Earned Diploma (91%)
 - Black = 1 (2%) (12.8%) 1/1 Earned Diploma (100%)

The Class of 2018 had 42 seniors trying to earn the IB Diploma. Looking at the White students, out of the 42 total students trying to earn the IB Diploma, 30 were White. So the White students made up 71% of the IB Diploma class of 2018. The number in red indicates the number of White students in the ENTIRE SRHS class of 2018. So, the White students in IB Diploma, as a percentage, was higher than the entire class of 2018 white population.

The Black population only had 1 student out of 42 or 2% of the entire IB Diploma Class. However, the Black population made up 12.8% of the entire SRHS Class of 2018 student population.

I have been working on recruitment, and I think you will see an increase in numbers. My goal is to get more minority students into the program.

For the 2019-2020 school year, I could not figure out the the ethnic breakdown by individual class (Class of 2020, Class of 2021, etc.), so I placed what the percentage is for the ENTIRE school.
