Evidence of Progress Monitoring (Please include narrative/description of the action taken. Where applicable, please include all measurable data.)	Data chats and analysis happen in a variety of ways at Oslo. iReady PD specifically on use of iReady data reports to guide differentiation was provided to teachers in September with department-based follow up sessions scheduled in October. Most current data are included in weekly staff bulletin, data is shared and discussed with faculty during monthly faculty meetings, and personalized data chats are included in weekly collaborative planning sessions (and/or biweekly in department meetings) with a focused target on planning around subgroup data and intervention needs. With recent Unit Assessment data available, an additional focus of data analysis is identifying previously proficient students who currently have a UA Weighted average below proficient and creating plans for intervention or remediation.
Results of Action Taken:	As a result of continued focus on data, teachers are more aware of student data and have the tools and skills to pull appropriate reports for their students and plan interventions/enrichment accordingly. This now also includes analysis of previously proficient students who are dropping out of proficiency according to Unit Assessment data. With a focus on differentiation, data analysis results in more data- driven differentiation which address the root deficits of specifically identified students in core classes, leading to increased student growth and proficiency.
Reflection:	Oslo is committed to data-driven decisions in the 2019-20 school year. By conducting frequent data review sessions with leadership and faculty, we look forward to making progress toward our goals.
