Explanation of Evidence: Attached is the agenda from our most recent Leadership Meeting, which was held on October 1. Data shows that based on the iReady Math Diagnostic, 40 of our black students scored 2 years below grade level, 30 scored 1 year below grade level, none scored on grade level, and one scored on grade level. On the iReady Reading Diagnostic, 40 black students scored 2 years below, 25 scored one year below, 7 scored on grade level, and 7 scored on or above grade level.

Results of Action Taken: Based on this data and some informal conversations our Instructional Coaches have had with students, they learned that many students are not doing their best work on these diagnostic tests. The reason for that is that if they do their absolute BEST work, they know that the "pathway" that the program will generate for them based on their performance will be difficult. So, they have chosen instead to not try hard, or in some cases intentionally answer incorrectly, with the intention that they will be assigned an easier pathway, so that when they are given iReady classwork to do, they don't have to stretch themselves to do it.

Reflection:

Because of this new data, we have decided to poll all of our students through FOCUS and ask them what would motivate them to improve their scores on the second diagnostic compared to their first. We have also offered an incentive the grade level that shows the highest number of students with the most gains between first and second diagnostic, not only to encourage students to try their best, but also to show what they really know. We are hopeful that by incentivizing this diagnostic, we will motivate the students to perform at their highest potential and give us true data of where they are and where they need to go.

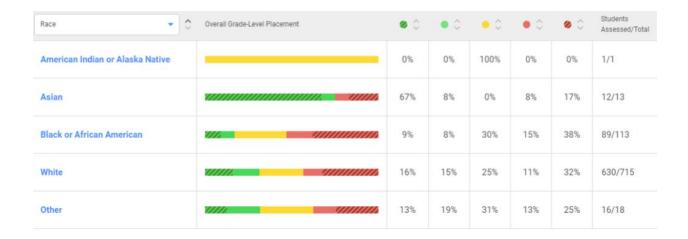
