**Results of Action Taken:** We hope to build character and responsibility within our current 5th graders while increasing the achievement level and fostering a sense of belonging in our 1st and 2nd graders.

**Reflection:** Students will begin the student peer mentorship as soon as they are able to interact safely. The AP and School Counselor will continue monitoring and implementing the student peer mentorship program throughout the year.



### Action Step 2.9 Student Peer Mentorship

Due to the current safety precautions in place on our school campus, students stay with their classroom peers throughout the day to minimize any cross contamination of possible germs. Once the safety precautions are minimized, our plan for Student peer mentorship is as follows:

African American students in 5<sup>th</sup> grade will be paired with African American students in 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. 5<sup>th</sup> grade students will be trained and given guidelines and helpful hints on how to be an effective peer mentors by the school counselor. Depending upon enrollment, up to 32 students will participate in the mentorship program. Student buddies will meet each Monday afternoon, for 15 minutes, at a specified time in the courtyard and will be supervised by either the Assistant Principal or School Counselor. Students will take turns reading books to each other, practicing sight words, addition/subtraction facts and will utilize conversation starters from Sanford Harmony to start the conversation and help foster a healthy bond between the peers. Sanford Harmony is our Social Emotional Learning Curriculum used across school.
