The greatest learning came from the survey our students completed. I was happy to learn of their satisfaction with the school, but angered and disappointed to learn that some students are using language that is not acceptable. That will be a focus moving into next school year.

Based upon the feedback from my departing 8th graders it is evident that they all like, feel safe, and feel valued at SCJH. The most disappointing and unacceptable response was to learn that a number of students casually use language that is unacceptable and inappropriate. That is something that I am certain no adults were aware of, but now that I have been made aware it will be addressed through character development to educate students about why that is inappropriate and hurtful, regardless of use or intent.

1.15: Data for students is reviewed at least monthly at faculty meetings. During the 4th quarter we completed our final NWEA assessment and used that to determine if students are meeting their growth goals. Areas of weakness are addressed through WIN period, success classes, and after school tutoring.

We place students in Success class (a daily class) if they are struggling with their school work or need extra assistance. Students can also be assigned or request to attend a WIN period with their teacher to get extra help.

1.18- N/A- We may have students who will need to attend summer school, but I will not know that until June 2 when grades are posted.

1.33- We do not offer any summer classes, but will do two days of 6th grade orientation in which all students may participate to prepare them for next school year.

We review student data formally and informally to meet student needs. Formally we will review data after NWEA test sessions to determine if any students need a change in schedule to move to the Success class. By second semester we have students identified and changed as needed. On a daily basis students may attend different Success classes depending upon their need. We have staff with different strengths so students will move within that 4th period to one of three groups when necessary. WIN periods allow for daily immediate assistance for students and this is based upon daily teacher observation or feedback from an assessment in class.

Regression Analysis- example attached

6th grade- No students regressed, but 50% of students did not meet growth expectations. None significantly below expected growth.

7th grade- One student regressed, but 60% of students did not meet growth expectations. One student who regressed was working at home, and then returned to school. He is a high achieving student who did not put forth his best effort on the test.

8th grade- No students regressed, but 25% of students did not meet growth expectations. None significantly below expected growth.

Additional Comments/Feedback: Tosha Jones is going to share her African American Student Council survey with SCJHS in order to help them establish a council. SJCHS will work on improving data collection for quarterly updates. SCJHS requested help with finding new hires via access to posting jobs on SDIRC Frontline. They already use Frontline, recruit at IRSC and Bethune Cookman and have reached out to the local NAACP for assistance. Holden suggested Dodds reach out to IRCHS about the lottery process for students as they are able to accept African American students prior to the lottery being held due to the Federal desegregation order. (As of 5/11, this had been done). SCJHS has been utilizing contacts at the GYAC and NAACP for student recruitment.
